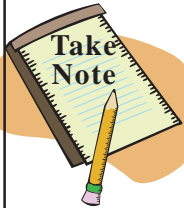

An Information for Students flyer will be distributed to students taking grade 12 diploma examination courses and an Information for Parents flyer will be made available at Parent-Teacher Interviews. These documents will also be available on Alberta Education's website at www.education.gov.ab.ca - Kindergarten to Grade 12 - Provincial Testing.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR STUDENTS REWRITING A DIPLOMA EXAM AND/OR RETAKING THE COURSE.

Students will be able to write their first diploma exam in any subject free of charge, but all subsequent attempts (**including retaking the course**) will be considered rewrites and students will be charged rewrite fees and must complete a rewrite application form. The fee to rewrite is \$25.00 plus G.S.T. or \$26.75, for each diploma examination. Students rewriting exams in January must submit their application, along with their cheque, to the SCHS general office by November 1st. Students submitting applications after this date will be responsible for mailing their payment to Alberta Education. Deadline for applications to Alberta Education is November 3rd. Cheques must be made payable to the **Minister of Finance** or paid by a major credit card.

NOTE: If a student rewrites a diploma exam, without paying the fee, the new exam mark and final mark in that course will not appear on the student's results statement or on their official transcript. If a student cannot rewrite a diploma exam due to illness or compassionate reasons, the student is eligible to rewrite at the next diploma examination administration, or the student can have the fee refunded. If a student requires a refund for any other reason, a \$10.00 processing fee will be charged.

A Sturgeon School Division bookmark will be presented to students, who have an 80% average in 25 credits (five of which must be English but excluding Special Projects, Work Experience, Learning Strategies, Sports Performance, RAP courses, locally developed courses, Work Study and Green Certificate). Students are listed in descending order of academic achievement.**

The staff of SCHS had a busy morning on October 6 during the professional development day. The teachers looked at the successes of our students over the last five years, noting that completion rates are up, as are the number of students eligible for Rutherford Scholarships. A slide presentation was made showing the growth of our ‘pyramids of intervention’ for students as the first component of our Alberta Initiative for School Improvement (A.I.S.I.) project to improve student achievement. The core leaders presented the SMART goals, as identified by each department as a part of these pyramids. A short discussion was held on the ‘Study Skills’ component of the project. The rest of the morning was spent looking at the third component which is applying reading strategies across the curriculum for all of our students in each classroom. Teachers applied the strategies of reading for purpose and the use of a t-chart for note taking. The support staff had several choices of activities to attend including Non-Violent Crisis Intervention (N.V.C.I.), 21 Keys, Office Best Practices, and Healthy Interactions. The afternoon was celebrated with other divisional schools to recognize staff with long term service awards and retirement tributes. The students of SCHS will certainly see the benefits from the discussions and activities that the staff participated in that day.

From Life Skills ... It's hard to believe that September has gone already. The students of lifeskills are working hard and enjoying the new school year. To start the year off, we attended a "Welcome Back Concert/Dance" with lots of other schools from the Greater Edmonton area. It was great fun! Thanks to Ross Sheppard (the host school).

We have started our "Foods" program and some of the students go shopping to Save On Foods for our weekly groceries. We have also started work experience, so look for our students at both McDonalds and Wal-Mart in St. Albert. Some students have been working hard with

"In-School Vocational Training" and collecting and shredding paper.

To end September, we went bowling in St. Albert then headed to the mall and everyone bought lunch. Before heading back to school we went for a walk along the river; the sights, sounds and smell of fall were enjoyed by all. Our favorite sport in physical education is floor hockey. Thanks to our many friends who join in our games; we look forward to you joining us.

We are lucky to have work experience students again this semester. We invite old and new friends to stop by and visit; our door is always open!

- Who is the audience?
- What is the purpose of the web page?
- How complete and accurate are the information and links provided?
- What other resources are available in this area (print and non-print)?
- What are the dates of coverage of the site? When was it last revised?
- Who is the author/producer?
- What is the authority or expertise of the individual or group that created this site?
- Is there any bias evident?
- Does the document follow good graphic design principals?
- Does the text follow basic rules of grammar, spelling, and literary composition?

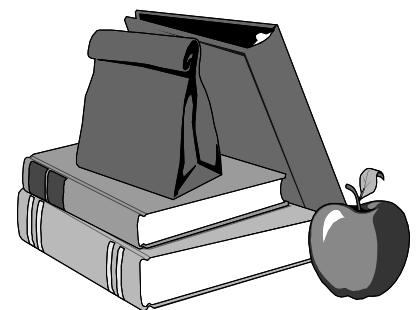

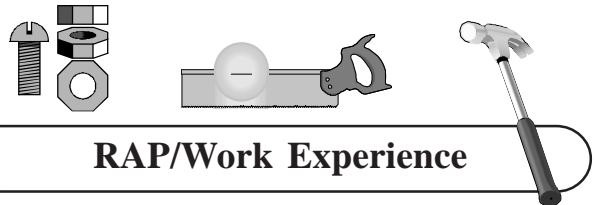

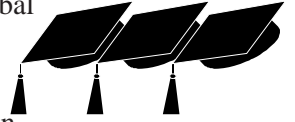

Our tour will be to Cuba during spring break this year. Please note that all students going on this tour **must** have a passport. Do not wait, apply now!

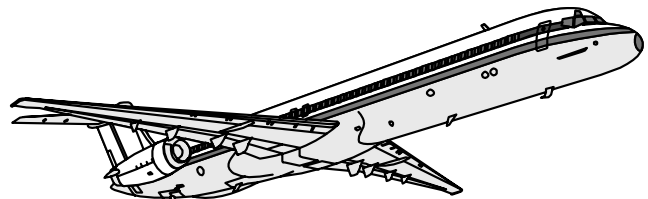
