Bus Evacuation Quick Reference Guide

Bus Operator Responsibility:

- The bus operator will communication the expectations of students during the evacuation prior to the date of the evacuation
- The bus operator will assign two students for suitable helpers to assist with the rear door evacuation, student #1 and #2
- The bus operator will assign one student as the leader to the muster point, student #3



- The bus operator will have a form for use on evacuation day

Student Responsibility:

- The student will have their hands free, and will not take anything off the bus
- When at the rear door will assume the skier stance: knees bent, one foot slightly forward, arms bent at elbow and hands in a fist, body slightly bent at waist
- Helpers will reach up, one hand cupping the elbow, and the other gripping the wrist firmly; when this has been achieved they will say "NOW"
- The student will push off with back leg and will step down to the ground
- The helpers do not pull the student from the bus, and do not let go until they have firm footing on the ground
- Proceed to muster point, 35 metres away from the bus

School Responsibility:

- The school will assign 1 staff member to each bus to observe, time the evacuation and complete the bus evacuation form
- At schools with K-4 students a supervisor may be requested to assist with rear evacuation
- The school will supply watches to time the evacuation
- The school will let staff know that students may be late for class
- The school in partnership with transportation and bus operators will set the date of the evacuation with bus operators– this is often done at the school start up meetings

Transportation Services Responsibility:

- Transportation will inform the school office staff of the bus evacuation schedule for their awareness of late students and buses with shared school locations
- Transportation in partnership with the schools and bus operators will set the date of the evacuation with bus operators– this is often done at the school start up meetings

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. How often are bus evacuations held?

- All regular route buses will do a rear door evacuation each year
- Special education buses without wheelchair students will do a front door evacuation, or may discuss the process of an evacuation with student if more appropriate

2. When would a bus evacuation be required?

Emergencies can arise from various situations. Examples include traffic accidents, fires, a chemical spill, or severe bus mechanical issues that pose a safety risk.
