Investing in Student Well-Being Through Inter-Ministerial Collaboration

The Sturgeon Public Schools Board of Trustees has formally submitted an advocacy letter to the Ministers of Education and Childcare, Health and Mental Health & Addiction. This letter calls for a provincial framework that aligns health and education services, with a focus on embedding mental health and primary care supports directly into school communities. The Board emphasizes that strategic collaboration across ministries is critical to student success, staff retention and long-term system sustainability.

August Board Meeting Approved

At their June 18 meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the addition of a Public Board Meeting on August 27, 2025, beginning at 1:00 p.m. A Committee of the Whole meeting will precede it at 9:00 a.m., focused on policy review.

This extra meeting was added to allow sufficient time to revise Board policies in response to legislative changes taking effect on September 1, 2025. In particular, *Board Policy 20: Sexual Orientation and Gender Identities* must be updated to align with new direction from Alberta Education.

The meeting will also support the timely completion of other scheduled policy updates for the 2025–2026 school year. These updates will help set up the next Board of Trustees—elected in October—for a strong start. The regularly scheduled Board meeting on September 24, 2025, will still take place as planned.

Gibbons School Amalgamation Approved

At the June 18th Public Board meeting, the Board of Trustees approved the amalgamation of Gibbons School and Landing Trail School. This decision is conditional on the provincial government approving the Gibbons & Landing Trail Solution for construction as part of the Division's Three-Year Capital Plan.

The proposed new K-9 school is the Division's top capital priority. Leading up to this decision, the Division hosted a community engagement event, gathered stakeholder feedback and held a public meeting in accordance with *Board Policy 15: School Closure*. Thank you to all families, staff and community members who participated and shared their perspectives.
